Enclosed you will find information concerning auditions. Auditions are scheduled for Wednesday, July 24, 2013, at 1:30 p.m. in Bencze Theatre. Please bring your script copy, the COMPLETED application form and professional attitude! The audition process will take approximately 2 minutes for each applicant. You will be reading the designated pages listed in this packet. Please be prepared to read for your most desired role; the director may require readings for additional characters, if desired. Prior to the auditions, the summer theatre workshop course will present a student-directed 10 minute play, *The Guest of Honor*. Auditions will begin after their performance.

Please take note that if you receive a part, you will be required to take *Theatre Workshop*, *offered M/W 1:00-1:50* and *Speech & Voice for the Performer*, *offered M/W 2:00-3:15*. Both of these courses will serve as our rehearsal time. Additional afternoon rehearsals will be required two weeks prior to the show and you will be notified of the rehearsal schedule on the first day of rehearsal. Scripts will be provided by the College and an additional \$10 t-shirt fee is required to participate in this production.

The breathtaking glamour and decadent excess of the Jazz Age come to the stage in F. Scott Fitzgerald's classic novel, and in Simon Levy's adaptation, approved by the Fitzgerald Estate. Setting is Long Island, New York in 1922.

Characters

<u>NICK CARRAWAY</u>: Midwestern newcomer to NYC; with a kind, gentle manner, main character/narrates the play (pg. 10, 54 in audition packet)

<u>DAISY BUCHANAN</u>: Nick's cousin and contemporary; compelling center of attention; high class, main character, southern with a voice that sounds like money. (pg. 14, 32, 33 in audition packet)

TOM BUCHANAN: Daisy's husband; contemporary of Nick's at Yale; millionaire sportsman and playboy; bullish and arrogant, powerful and cruel (pg. 41, 44 in audition packet)

JORDAN BAKER: Daisy's friend; New York socialite; golf champion; emancipated and self-assured, from small southern town (pg. 28, 49 in audition packet)

<u>JAY GATSBY:</u> in love with Daisy; from a poor family but is rich; charming, dangerously sexy and romantic with a disarming smile (pg. 25, 26, 48 in audition packet)

GEORGE B. WILSON: blue-collar garage owner; worn by life with little ambition; married to Myrtle, spiritless and anemic (pg. 16, 45 in audition packet)

MYRTLE WILSON: George's wife and Tom's mistress; voluptuous and sexy; lower class (pg. 16, 45 in audition packet)

Mr. CHESTER MCKEE: artist in NYC; has airs and an effeminate way about him (pg. 18 in audition packet)

Mrs. LUCIELLE McKEE: Chester's wife, eccentric and unique (pg. 18 in audition packet)

MEYER WOLFSHEIM: shady New York businessman; seedy but classy (pg. 23 in audition packet)

Mrs. MICHAELIS: visits the area, witness to crime scene, minor role (pg. 46 in audition packet)

POLICEMAN: minor role, records accident, strong & confident (pg. 46 in audition packet)

ENSEMBLE/EXTRAS: strong dancer; wild during the party scenes; of the Jazz/Flapper period (will dance in two scenes) (no auditions will be performed for extras on July 24)
