DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES (DSS)

Disability Support Services provides reasonable accommodations and services for qualified students with documented disabilities.

What is a disability? What does DSS do?

The Americans with Disabilities Act, 1990, defines a disability as a “mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities.” Walking, eating, talking, breathing, writing, listening, and learning are examples of major life activities. If you have a documented impairment, you may be entitled to certain accommodations under the ADA.

What are “reasonable accommodations and services”?

Reasonable accommodations and services may include priority registration, extra time on tests, special seating arrangements, assistance with class notes, and/or alternate format materials (such as tape recorders, large print, or other adaptive technology) which meet the individual needs of the person with the disability.

Admission and Financial Aid Tips

- Starting early is key! This ensures that all paperwork and financial aid are in place in time for registration. You can be admitted in advance.
- Complete an Application for Admission online or by submitting to any Student Affairs location.
- Provide appropriate identification documents to validate citizenship.
- Request transcripts/GED scores from all schools previously attended.
- Ensure that the Admissions and Financial Aid offices have your most current mailing address.
- Check your College e-mail regularly for important announcements.
- Sign and return Admission Agreement, indicating admission status, and provide any other requested documents.
- File early for financial aid! You may apply for federal assistance online by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The College financial aid code is **001018**.
- Check the College Web site at www.wallace.edu for scholarship information.
- Respond promptly to all correspondence from the Financial Aid Office. **Do not wait until registration to finalize your financial aid. It should be completed before you register for classes.**
- Take your placement exam prior to registration.
- Attend scheduled Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR) session; meet with your advisor and register for classes.
- Pay tuition by appropriate deadline.

Placement and Challenge Exam Procedures

Students must schedule an appointment for the ACCUPLACER placement test via the RegisterBlast system.

On the **Wallace Campus**, students may schedule an appointment for the ACCUPLACER placement test by going to <https://www.registerblast.com/wccmain/exam>

On the **Sparks Campus**, students may schedule an appointment for the ACCUPLACER placement test by going to <https://www.registerblast.com/wccsparks/exam>

If first scores on ACCUPLACER are unsatisfactory to students, they may challenge English, math and/or reading ACCUPLACER placement scores by retesting one time only during the calendar year. A fee of \$10 will be charged for each section of the test a student is retaking. **Students must wait two weeks before being allowed to retest, and students must complete the free remediation program, ACCUPLACER Online Course and Practice Tests, which may be found at: <http://www.longsdalepub.com/accuplacer>.** The school number is 68015 and school key is collegesuccess. Information on exemptions for the ACCUPLACER placement test may be found at http://www.wallace.edu/admissions/placement_testing.

Payment forms must be processed in the Business Office or appropriate designated office on each campus. Students must bring a receipt and a federal or state photo identification to the Testing Center. Technology-Based Instruction

Information About Online and Hybrid Classes

Online Courses:

- An online course allows students to complete almost all of their course work without visiting campus.
- All course lecture, study materials, quizzes and assignments are completed online at a time convenient for the student.
- Course exams are taken on-campus.
- Instructors teaching online courses will announce exam dates on the first day of class by posting this information in the Blackboard Learning Management System.
- Requires completion of eLearning Training prior to registering. Login to Blackboard to access eLearning Training. Both online and hybrid courses are delivered over the Internet using the Blackboard Learning Management System. Blackboard can be accessed at courses.wallace.edu.

Hybrid Courses:

- A hybrid course allows students to complete half of their course work off-campus and meet on-campus during regularly scheduled class meetings for half of the course dates.
- Allows regular, face-to-face interaction with the instructor and other students.
- Course exams are taken on-campus during scheduled course meeting times.

Both online and hybrid courses are delivered over the Internet using the Blackboard Learning Management System. Blackboard can be accessed at courses.wallace.edu.

Fees and costs for online and hybrid courses:

- Online and hybrid courses are offered at the same tuition and fee rate as all other courses, there are no extra charges.
- In extenuating circumstances a student may apply for an off-campus proctor. Any costs associated with using an off-campus proctor are the responsibility of the student.
 - o Off-campus exam approval is only given for military deployment, sudden illness or injury or other major life event.

GovNET Makes WCC Technology Access Easier

GovNET is an account that allows you to access multiple systems at Wallace Community College using just one username and password. Currently, the systems include Blackboard, student email, campus computers, and campus Wi-Fi. Imagine one username and password to maintain for all those WCC systems you use. Wouldn't that make your school life easier?!

Some information you must know about your GovNET account:

1. **Your GovNET account grants access to campus computers, student e-mail, campus Wi-Fi, and Blackboard. Your WCC acceptance letter contains your GovNET username.**
2. **GovNET Username:**
 - o *Initially admitted on or after Jan. 12, 2018:*
 - *First initial, last name and last four of Student #
 - o *Initially admitted before January 12, 2018:*
 - First initial, last name and four numbers
 - o Format is jsmith1234.
3. **GovNET Initial Password – must be reset before use with Blackboard and email:**
 - o Initial password- first 3 letters in last name, 2-digit birth year and student number, first letter capitalized, i.e. for **Smith** born in **1996** with student number **1234567**, the initial password is **Smig61234567**.
 - You must change password before use with Blackboard, student email, or campus Wi-Fi.
 - It must be 10 characters or more and have uppercase, lowercase, and numbers.
 - o To change your password so you can use Blackboard and email, login with your default username and password to :
 - Off campus - passwords.wallace.edu to update your password
 - On campus - campus computer to update your password
4. **With your password reset, you are ready to use your GovNET username and password for Blackboard, student email, campus computers, and campus Wi-Fi**







The **STUDENT INFORMATION CENTER (myWCC)** is an online information resource through which students can apply for College services, track the status of College admissions/records and financial aid files, register for classes, check grades, print unofficial transcripts, print degree plans, check financial aid status, check their e-mails, and much more. Students are encouraged to monitor their accounts to be sure required documents are submitted **before** registration. Submission of all required documents will expedite the registration process and in most cases will eliminate the requirement for students to visit the campus and wait in long lines. Students who do not have Internet access in their homes may use computers on campus to take advantage of the features available through **myWCC**.

Workforce Development Classes

CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)

An ongoing need exists for certified nurse assistants in the region. This 25-day course prepares students for the state Nurse Aid Registry exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday in the Gary Health Building at the Wallace Campus - Dothan and at the Sparks Campus in Eufaula. Tuition and fees (including books and the nurse aide registry exam) are \$725. A minimum of seven students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

COMPUTER SKILLS FOR TODAY'S WORKPLACE

This six-week program will help students develop computer skills to work in an office environment. Skills range from basic use and keyboarding to proficiency in Microsoft® Excel®, PowerPoint®, and Word®. Classes meet on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,500. A minimum of four students is required.

DENTAL ASSISTANT

This 20-week program prepares students for entry-level positions within dental offices. Students will learn dental anatomy, 4-handed techniques, dental laboratory and x-ray skills, charting skills, safety procedures, and general office protocols. Classes meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. for the first 18 weeks of the course. The following 2 weeks are spent in clinical externship at a local dental office. The final 2 weeks of the program are dedicated to course/skills review and the performance of a complete, new-patient work-up. Tuition and fees (includes books and supplies) is \$1,700. A minimum of 6 students is required. Prerequisites include the ACT® WorkKeys Reading for Information and Locating Information tests. Students must also submit to a competitive interview process to be considered for admission. Students must also begin their Hepatitis B inoculation regimen before the first day of class. High school diploma or equivalent is required for admission. WIOA approved.

PREAPPRENTICE ELECTRICAL LINEMAN TRAINING

Develop skills to work in the electrical distribution industry by becoming a lineworker. This seven-week course will prepare students in pole climbing, CDL training, electrical theory, line make-ups, interpersonal skills, interview techniques, and much more. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, use of tools, and personal protective equipment) are \$3,500. A minimum of eight students is required. Prerequisites include a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination and a two-year driving record from the state troopers' office. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT

Develop skills to assist an ophthalmologist or an optometrist in an eye-care facility. This 14-week training course could be the starting point for a new career in the health care field. Classes meet on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CODING

This 40-week course prepares students to take the AAPC coding exam. Classes meet on Tuesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, AAPC student membership, and national exam) are \$1,700. A minimum of ten students is required. Prerequisites include proof of taking Human Anatomy and Medical Terminology courses. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

READY TO WORK (RTW)

Alabama's Ready to Work program provides a career pathway for individuals with limited education and employment experience. Ready to Work's workplace environment provides trainees the entry-level skills required for employment with most businesses and industries in Alabama. The training focuses on basic education (applied math, workplace documents, graphic literacy, and communication skills), computer technology, problem-solving, workplace behaviors, and job preparation skills. Those achieving successful test scores will receive a National Career Readiness Certificate along with an Alabama Certified Worker certificate. Classes meet at varying times depending on campus location. This course is free to the public. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission.

SHEET METAL TECHNICIAN

This 10 week course is designed to introduce individuals to the fundamentals of Sheet metal shop operation. Shop safety and basic shop operation practices will be covered. Correct operation of Sheet metal hand tools, rotary machines, metal shears and roll forming machines are included in lab work. Fundamentals of Sheet metal layout will be practiced and applied to fabrication scenarios as well as an overview of basic mathematics and blueprint reading. Classes meet Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in building 473 (general purpose building) on the Wallace campus in Dothan. Tuition and fees (including books and tool kit) are \$2,000. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

INDUSTRIAL WELDING

This 12 week course prepares students for employment in the Welding industry as structural welders in a production environment. Students will gain hands on experience with Oxy-fuel cutting, Plasma Arc Cutting, Gas Metal Arc Welding as well as an overview of blueprint reading and basic mathematics. The program includes a wide variety of welding experiences for structural and production welding. Students can exit the course after 12 weeks with a certificate in welding and an AWS welding certification. In addition, the Wallace Campus has been designated by the American Welding Society as an Accredited Testing Facilities. Classes meet Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the Welding Technology building on the Wallace campus in Dothan. Tuition and fees (including books and tool kit) are \$3,500. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.


