## DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES (DSS)

Disability Support Services provides reasonable accommodations and services for qualified students with documented disabilities.

### What is a disability? What does DSS do?

The Americans with Disabilities Act, 1990, defines a disability as a “mental or physical impairment which substantially limits one or more major life activities.” Walking, eating, talking, breathing, writing, listening, and learning are examples of major life activities. If you have a documented impairment, you may be entitled to certain accommodations under the ADA.

### What are “reasonable accommodations and services”?

Reasonable accommodations and services may include priority registration, extra time on tests, special seating arrangements, assistance with class notes, and/or alternate format materials (such as tape recorders, large print, or other adaptive technology) which meet the individual needs of the person with the disability.

# Admission and Financial Aid Tips

- Starting early is key! This ensures that all paperwork and financial aid are in place in time for registration. You can be admitted in advance.
- Complete an Application for Admission online or by submitting to any Student Affairs location.
- Provide appropriate identification documents to validate citizenship.
- Request transcripts/GED scores from all schools previously attended.
- Ensure that the Admissions and Financial Aid offices have your most current mailing address.
- Check your College e-mail regularly for important announcements.
- Sign and return Admission Agreement, indicating admission status, and provide any other requested documents.
- File early for financial aid! You may apply for federal assistance online by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). The College financial aid code is **001018**.
- Check the College Web site at [www.wallace.edu](http://www.wallace.edu) for scholarship information.
- Respond promptly to all correspondence from the Financial Aid Office. **Do not wait until registration to finalize your financial aid. It should be complete before you register for classes.**
- Take your placement exam prior to registration.
- Attend scheduled Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR) session; meet with your advisor and register for classes.
- Pay tuition by appropriate deadline.

## Placement and Challenge Exam Procedures

According to Alabama State Board of Education Policy 802.1, students may challenge English, math, and/or reading ASSET®/COMPASS™ placement scores by retesting one time only if first scores are unsatisfactory. A fee of \$8 is charged to retake COMPASS™.

The CIS 146 challenge exam is also available. This exam is administered in the testing center in Grimsley Hall 126 on the Wallace Campus. A list of testing dates and times is available on the College website at [www.wallace.edu](http://www.wallace.edu) under Student Services.

The Alabama Community College System Biology Placement Exam is available for students who desire to exempt BIO 103, which is the prerequisite for BIO 201—Anatomy and Physiology I and BIO 220—General Microbiology. A fee of \$26.25 is required at registration, prior to biology placement testing. Students may not retest.

Payment forms must be processed in the Business Office or appropriate designated office on each campus. Students must bring a receipt and a federal or state photo identification to the Test Center. For Test Center hours, contact the Wallace Campus at 334-983-3521 (Ext. 2296, 2281, and 2294) or the Sparks Campus at 334-687-3543 (Ext. 4210).

# Technology-Based Instruction

## Information About Online and Hybrid Classes

Wallace Community College uses Blackboard® to support its online instructional programs. This technology provides students with an opportunity to pursue courses in formats that meet all course requirements while reducing in-class time. Faculty members are able to post course syllabi, contact information, and course content and ensure that students are aware of online activities that require participation, such as communicating with the instructor and other students, completing online assignments and quizzes, and posting course grades. Students must be aware of the requirements for each course in which they are enrolled.

### Online and Hybrid Courses with On-Campus Labs

The Internet is used to deliver instruction in the following courses:

- Online courses are delivered over the Internet using Blackboard®. Students will be given the option of completing exams on campus with their instructor or use an approved off campus proctor. It will be the student's responsibility to meet all requirements if the off campus proctor option is chosen.
- Hybrid courses with on-campus meetings meet online for a portion of the course meetings. Students are required to attend scheduled on-campus sessions at the designated campus.
- Online and hybrid courses require use of the Blackboard® system. Students can access the Blackboard® system at [courses.wallace.edu](http://courses.wallace.edu).

### Requirements and Assistance for Online and Hybrid Courses

## Online Classes

Wallace Community College offers many classes that reduce the amount of time students must physically be on campus. These online and hybrid classes are indicated by “N” or “H” in the section number. Students taking online classes are not required to attend weekly meetings but are required to attend scheduled on campus exams or receive approval for using an off campus proctor. If the off campus exam proctor option is chosen it is the student's responsibility to complete all required approvals well in advance of the exam date. Hybrid classes require students to attend weekly on-campus meetings throughout the semester.

Students interested in taking online or hybrid classes should carefully consider their learning styles. These classes require students to be self-motivated and able to complete assignments with minimal supervision. Students should also possess strong computer skills. The eLearning training will help ensure that students are ready for online courses. The eLearning training is highly recommended for all students, even those not taking online courses.

<b>Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR)</b>	New student advising and preregistration sessions will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel via letter of invitation.
<b>Placement Testing</b>	Placement tests are required for all new students unless they meet exemption criteria as stated in the College catalog. Placement tests will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel by letter of invitation. Prior to the scheduled test date, the student must complete an Application for Admission. Students must bring a valid driver license or state-issued identification card to the testing session and may also bring a calculator. Students who desire to improve placement scores may contact the Counseling Office at 334-556-2296. An \$8 fee will be charged for retesting.
<b>Tuition Payment</b>	Tuition and fees are calculated on completion of advising and preregistration. Students have the option of paying tuition and fees anytime <b>before 4:00 p.m., May 18</b> . Students who preregister but fail to pay tuition and fees by the noted deadline will be removed from the computer and are at risk of losing their class selections. If you are dropped for nonpayment, you must reregister <b>May 20-21</b> or during late registration, <b>May 26-27</b> . A fee of \$25 is required for late registration, <b>May 26-27</b> . All students, including those with scholarships and financial aid, must clear Business Office procedures to complete registration.

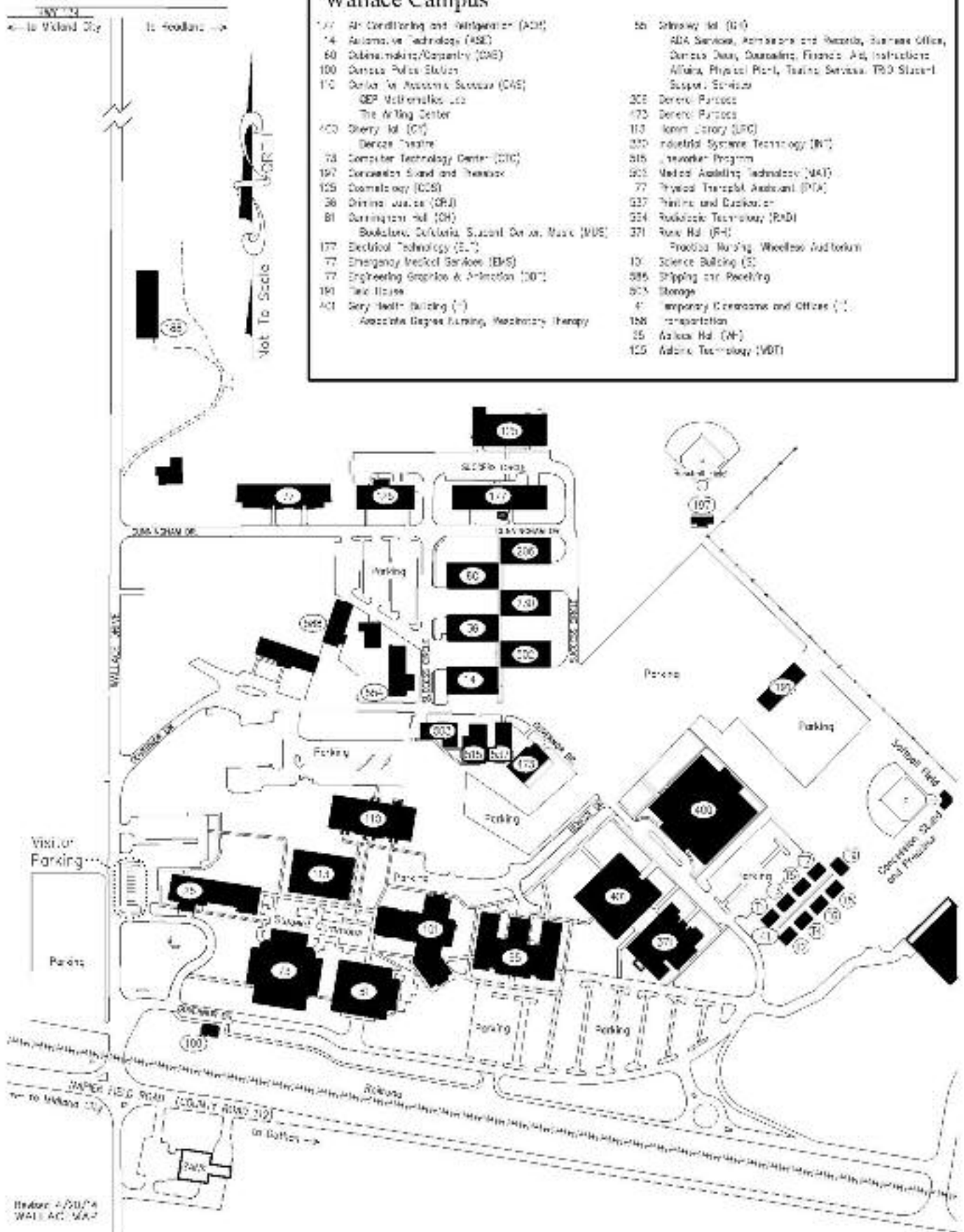

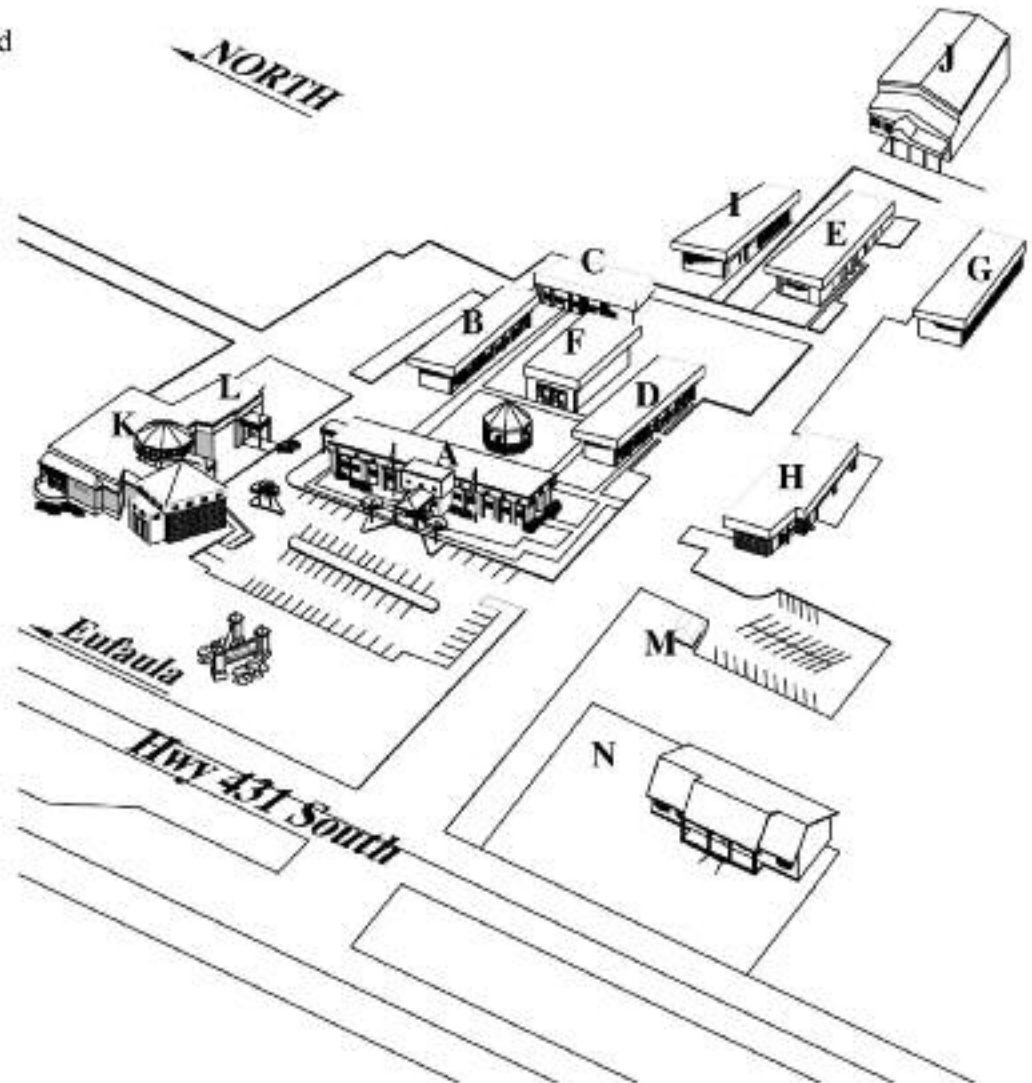

## Workforce Development Classes

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### **CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)**

An ongoing need exists for certified nurse assistants in the region. This 94-hour course prepares students for the state Nurse Aid Registry exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 5:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books and the nurse aide registry exam) are \$725. A minimum of seven students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIA approved.

### **COMPUTER SKILLS FOR TODAY'S WORKPLACE**

This six-week program will help students develop computer skills to work in an office environment. Skills range from basic use and keyboarding to proficiency in Microsoft® Excel®, PowerPoint®, and Word®. Classes meet on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,500. A minimum of four students is required. WIA approved.

### **DENTAL ASSISTANT**

This 14-week program prepares students for entry-level positions within dental offices. Students will learn dental anatomy, 4-handed techniques, dental laboratory and x-ray skills, charting skills, safety procedures, and general office protocols. Classes meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. for the first 10 weeks of the course. The following 2 weeks are spent in clinical externship at a local dental office. The final 2 weeks of the program are dedicated to course/skills review and the performance of a complete, new-patient work-up. Tuition and fees (includes books and supplies) is \$1,400. A minimum of 6 students is required. Prerequisites include the ACT® WorkKeys Reading for Information and Locating Information tests. Students must also submit to a competitive interview process to be considered for admission. Students must also begin their Hepatitis B inoculation regimen before the first day of class. High school diploma or equivalent is required for admission. WIA approved.

### **PREAPPRENTICE ELECTRICAL LINEMAN TRAINING**

Develop skills to work in the electrical distribution industry by becoming a lineworker. This seven-week course will prepare students in pole climbing, CDL training, electrical theory, line make-ups, interpersonal skills, interview techniques, and much more. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, use of tools, and personal protective equipment) are \$3,500. A minimum of eight students is required. Prerequisites include a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination and a two-year driving record from the state troopers' office. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIA approved.

### **OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT**

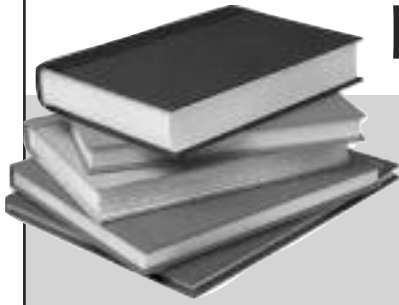
Develop skills to assist an ophthalmologist or an optometrist in an eye-care facility. This 14-week training course could be the starting point for a new career in the health care field. Classes meet on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIA approved.

### **PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CODING**

This 40-week course prepares students to take the AAPC coding exam. Classes meet on Tuesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, AAPC student membership, and national exam) are \$1,400. A minimum of ten students is required. Prerequisites include proof of taking Human Anatomy and Medical Terminology courses. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIA approved.

### **READY TO WORK (RTW)**

Ready To Work is an eight-week, employer-designed course that provides trainees with entry-level skills required for employment with most industries and businesses in Alabama. The training focuses on basic education (applied math, reading and locating information, and communication skills), computer skills (Microsoft® Excel®, Windows 7®, and Word®), problem-solving, workplace behavior, manufacturing (precision measurement, safety), and job acquisition skills. Those achieving successful test scores will receive an Alabama Career Readiness Certificate along with an Alabama Certified Worker certificate. Classes meet at varying times depending on campus location. This course is free to the public. A minimum of five students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission.

# myWCC



The **STUDENT INFORMATION CENTER (myWCC)** is an online information resource through which students can apply for College services, track the status of College admissions/records and financial aid files, register for classes, check grades, print unofficial transcripts, print degree plans, check financial aid status, check their e-mails, and much more. Students are encouraged to monitor their accounts to be sure required documents are submitted **before** registration. Submission of all required documents will expedite the registration process and in most cases will eliminate the requirement for students to visit the campus and wait in long lines. Students who do not have Internet access in their homes may use computers on campus to take advantage of the features available through **myWCC**.

To access myWCC, log on to the Wallace Community College Web site, [www.wallace.edu](http://www.wallace.edu), and follow the steps below:

1. Click on the Quick Links tab.
2. Click myWCC.
3. Click LOGIN at the top of the screen.
4. Enter User ID and PIN. The default User ID and PIN number is your Social Security number and date of birth (six digits).
5. Click Student Information Center

#### TO CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR ADMISSION/RECORDS FILE:

Click on Student Records and then Admission Requirements. If you have attended other colleges before applying to WCC, you will also need to click on Prior Transcript Requirements to check the status of other college transcripts.

**NOTE:** All required documents must be submitted to the Admissions Office before financial aid can be awarded.

#### TO CHECK THE STATUS OF YOUR FINANCIAL AID FILE:

Click on Financial Information and then Financial Aid Requirements. Select appropriate year.

**NOTE:** All required documents must be submitted before financial aid can be awarded.

#### ADDITIONAL FEATURES:

1. Degree Plan – to view/print your current program degree plan.
2. My Schedule – to view/print your current class schedule.
3. Unofficial Transcript – to view/print your unofficial transcript.
4. Transcript Request – to request official transcripts from WCC for admission to other colleges, for employment interviews, etc.
5. View Transcript Requests – to check the status of a request to have your transcript sent from WCC to another entity.
6. Financial Aid Shopping Sheet – to view all Financial Aid that has been awarded.
7. Financial Aid Status – to view your Financial Aid Award Summary.
8. View My Grades – to view your final grades for the term.
9. Registration – to register for classes once you are authorized by your advisor. All new and transfer students must go through the registration process at least one term before being authorized by an advisor.
10. Modify Contact Information – to update address, e-mail address, and phone number.

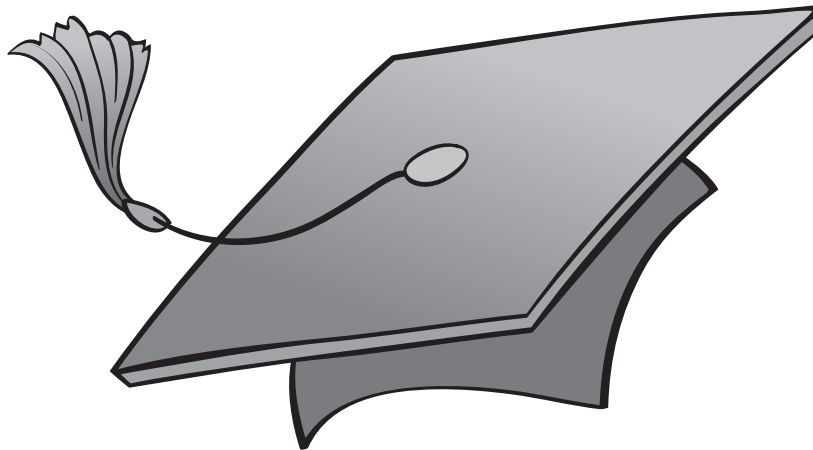

The GED computer-based exam is given at the Center for Economic and Workforce Development in Dothan and at the A building on the Sparks Campus in Eufaula. The GED exam consists of the following four sections: Reasoning through Language Arts, Mathematical Reasoning, Science, and Social Studies. The cost of the exam is \$120 for the complete battery or \$30 per content area. Each content area can be taken individually or as selected by the examinee. ## Notes to the Faculty:

- Faculty teaching courses that do not follow the standard day/time scheduling scheme will determine test dates and times within the testing period that best complement the standard schedule.
- Faculty members in technical, nursing, and allied health programs whose courses combine theory, lab, and clinical meetings should use the theory meeting time to schedule their final exams.
