Receiving RN pins were Latasha Q. Gooden, Tammie Y. Smith, Dorothy Warren, and Michele Latish Waters.

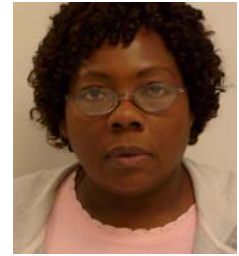

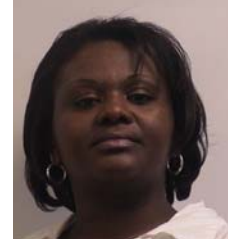

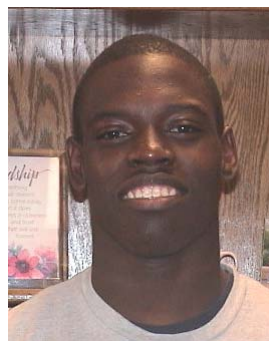
