About the Certified Dietary Manager Program...

A certified dietary manager (CDM) works with registered dietitians to provide quality nutritional care for clients in a variety of settings, including health-care facilities and schools. They perform a variety of specialized tasks, like overseeing large-scale meal planning and preparation; budgeting for and purchasing food, equipment, and supplies; enforcing sanitary and safety regulations; and preparing records and reports.

“Employment of food service managers is expected to increase about as fast as the average for all occupations through 2016.

About the WCC Program

- ♦ High school diploma or equivalent required to enter the program
 - ♦ 20-week program. Classes meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings, 5:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.
 - ♦ Classes meet at the WCC Center for Economic and Workforce Development in Dothan, Alabama.
 - ♦ Program length: 160 contact hours. Fifty (50) field experience hours are required for those currently employed in the food industry. An additional 150 field hours are required for those not currently employed in the food industry. Field experience hours will be completed as scheduled by course instructors.
 - ♦ Students may sit for the certified dietary manager exam upon completion of course.
- Fees:**
- ♦ \$1,995 (includes required books, materials, and exam fee)
 - ♦ Registration is not complete until the registration form and entire course fee are received.
 - ♦ Class size is limited to 15 participants.
