
Admission and Financial Aid Tips

- Starting early is key! This ensures that all paperwork and financial aid are in place in time for registration. You can be admitted in advance.
- Complete an Application for Admission online or by submitting to any Student Affairs location.
- Provide appropriate identification documents to validate citizenship.
- Request transcripts/GED scores from all schools previously attended.
- Ensure that the Admissions and Financial Aid offices have your most current mailing address.
- Check your College e-mail regularly for important announcements.
- Sign and return Admission Agreement, indicating admission status, and provide any other requested documents.
- File early for financial aid! You may apply for federal assistance online by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The College financial aid code is **001018**.
- Check the College Web site at www.wallace.edu for scholarship information.
- Respond promptly to all correspondence from the Financial Aid Office. Do not wait until registration to finalize your financial aid. It should be completed before you register for classes.
- Take your placement exam prior to registration.
- Attend scheduled Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR) session; meet with your advisor and register for classes.
- Pay tuition by appropriate deadline.

Placement and Challenge Exam Procedures

Students must schedule an appointment for the ACCUPLACER placement test via the RegisterBlast system.

On the Wallace Campus, students may schedule an appointment for the ACCUPLACER placement test by going to https://www.registerblast.com/wccmain/exam or using this barcode:







According to Alabama State Board of Education Policy 802.1, students may challenge English, math, and/or reading ACCUPLACER[®] placement scores by retesting <u>one time only</u> if first scores are unsatisfactory. A fee of \$10 will be charged for each section of the test a student is retaking. Students must wait two weeks before being allowed to retest.

Payment forms must be processed in the Business Office or appropriate designated office on each campus. Students must bring a receipt and a federal or state photo identification to the Test Center. For Test Center hours, contact the Wallace Campus at 334-983-3521 (Ext. 2296) or the Sparks Campus at 334-687-3543 (Ext. 4249).

Technology-Based Instruction Information About Online and Hybrid Classes

Online Courses:

- An online course allows students to complete almost all of their course work without visiting campus.
- All course lecture, study materials, quizzes and assignments are completed online at a time convenient for the student.
- Course exams are taken on-campus.
- Instructors teaching online courses will announce exam dates on the first day of class by posting this information in the Blackboard Learning Management System.
- Requires completion of eLearning Training prior to registering. Login to Blackboard to access eLearning Training. Both online and hybrid courses are delivered over the Internet using the Blackboard Learning Management System. Blackboard can be accessed at courses.wallace.edu.

Hybrid Courses:

- A hybrid course allows students to complete half of their course work off-campus and meet on-campus during regularly scheduled class meetings for half of the course dates.
- Allows regular, face-to-face interaction with the instructor and other students.
- Course exams are taken on-campus during scheduled course meeting times.

Both online and hybrid courses are delivered over the Internet using the Blackboard Learning Management System. Blackboard can be accessed at courses.wallace.edu.

Fees and costs for online and hybrid courses:

- Online and hybrid courses are offered at the same tuition and fee rate as all other courses, there are no extra charges.
- In extenuating circumstances a student may apply for an off-campus proctor. Any costs associated with using an off-campus proctor are the responsibility of the student.







Notes to the Faculty:

- Faculty teaching courses that do not follow the standard day/time scheduling scheme will determine test dates and times within the testing period that best complement the standard schedule.
- Faculty members in technical, nursing, and allied health programs whose courses combine theory, lab, and clinical meetings should use the theory meeting time to schedule their final exams.
- Faculty members teaching distance education classes and those who offer traditional course final exams via Wallace Online will make arrangements for computer labs for their exams.
- Faculty should remember that traditional courses following the standard day/time scheduling scheme take priority over distance education courses. Distance education courses must make allowances in scheduling to accommodate students' traditional course final exam schedules.

## **Computer Lab Printing Policy**

Prepaid print cards are required to print in Wallace Community College computer labs. Print cards are available in the bookstore or library on either campus. The cards are \$5.00 each plus tax.

To print, enter the code listed on the print card into the print limit interface on lab computers. The account is loaded automatically upon logging in with a username and password. Students will be able to view their print limit account from any lab computer.

## Wallace Community College Workforce Development Classes

### CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)

An ongoing need exists for certified nurse assistants in the region. This 25-day course prepares students for the state Nurse Aid Registry exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday from at the Center for Economic and Workforce Development in Dothan and at the Sparks Campus in Eufaula. Tuition and fees (including books and the nurse aide registry exam) are \$725. A minimum of seven students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

### COMPUTER SKILLS FOR TODAY'S WORKPLACE

This six-week program will help students develop computer skills to work in an office environment. Skills range from basic use and keyboarding to proficiency in Microsoft® Excel®, PowerPoint®, and Word®. Classes meet on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 9:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,500. A minimum of four students is required.

### DENTAL ASSISTANT

This 20-week program prepares students for entry-level positions within dental offices. Students will learn dental anatomy, 4-handed techniques, dental laboratory and x-ray skills, charting skills, safety procedures, and general office protocols. Classes meet Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. for the first 18 weeks of the course. The following 2 weeks are spent in clinical externship at a local dental office. The final 2 weeks of the program are dedicated to course/skills review and the performance of a complete, new-patient work-up. Tuition and fees (includes books and supplies) is \$1,700. A minimum of 6 students is required. Prerequisites include the ACT® WorkKeys Reading for Information and Locating Information tests. Students must also submit to a competitive interview process to be considered for admission. Students must also begin their Hepatitis B inoculation regimen before the first day of class. High school diploma or equivalent is required for admission. WIOA approved.

### PREAPPRENTICE ELECTRICAL LINEWORKER TRAINING

Develop skills to work in the electrical distribution industry by becoming a lineworker. This seven-week course will prepare students in pole climbing, CDL training, electrical theory, line make-ups, interpersonal skills, interview techniques, and much more. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, use of tools, and personal protective equipment) are \$3,500. A minimum of eight students is required. Prerequisites include a Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination and a two-year driving record from the state troopers' office. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

### **OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT**

Develop skills to assist an ophthalmologist or an optometrist in an eye-care facility. This 14-week training course could be the starting point for a new career in the health care field. Classes meet on Monday and Wednesday evenings from 6:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. Tuition and fees (includes books) are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

### PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CODING

This 40-week course prepares students to take the AAPC coding exam. Classes meet on Tuesday evenings from 5:30 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. Tuition and fees (including books, AAPC student membership, and national exam) are \$1,700. A minimum of ten students is required. Prerequisites include proof of taking Human Anatomy and Medical Terminology courses. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

### **READY TO WORK (RTW)**

Ready To Work is an eight-week, employer-designed course that provides trainees with entry-level skills required for employment with most industries and businesses in Alabama. The training focuses on basic education (applied math, reading and locating information, and communication skills), computer skills (Microsoft® Excel®, Windows 7®, and Word®), problem-solving, workplace behavior, manufacturing (precision measurement, safety), and job acquisition skills. Those achieving successful test scores will receive a National Career Readiness Certificate along with an Alabama Certified Worker certificate. Classes meet at varying times depending on campus location. This course is free to the public. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission.

### SHEET METAL TECHNICIAN

This 10 week course is designed to introduce individuals to the fundamentals of Sheet metal shop operation. Shop safety and basic shop operation practices will be covered. Correct operation of Sheet metal hand tools, rotary machines, metal shears and roll forming machines are included in lab work. Fundamentals of Sheet metal layout will be practiced and applied to fabrication scenarios as well as an overview of basic mathematics and blueprint reading. Classes meet Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in building 473 (general purpose building) on the Wallace campus in Dothan. Tuition and fees (including books and tool kit) are \$2,000. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.

### INDUSTRIAL WELDING

This 12 week course prepares students for employment in the Welding industry as structural welders in a production environment. Students will gain hands on experience with Oxy-fuel cutting, Plasma Arc Cutting, Gas Metal Arc Welding as well as an overview of blueprint reading and basic mathematics The program includes a wide variety of welding experiences for structural and production welding. Students can exit the course after 12 weeks with a certificate in welding and an AWS welding certification. In addition, the Wallace Campus has been designated by the American Welding Society as an Accredited Testing Facilities. Classes meet Monday through Thursday from 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the Welding Technology building on the Wallace campus in Dothan. Tuition and fees (including books and tool kit) are \$3,500. A minimum of six students is required. High school diploma or equivalent required for admission. WIOA approved.


