Effective fall semester 2010, tuition will be adjusted to \$90 per credit hour. Tuition will be adjusted \$2 per credit hour each year thereafter. Admission and Financial Aid Tips

- Starting early is key! This ensures that all paperwork and financial aid are in place in time for registration.
- Complete an Application for Admission and return it to any Student Affairs location.
- Provide appropriate identification documents to validate your citizenship.
- Request transcripts/GED certificate from all previous schools attended.
- Ensure that the Admissions and Financial Aid offices have your most current mailing address.
- Check your College e-mail regularly for important announcements.
- You will receive an Admission Agreement indicating admission status. Sign and return this promptly and provide any other requested documents.
- File early for financial aid! You may apply for federal assistance online by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The College's financial aid code is **001018**.
- Check the College Web site at www.wallace.edu for scholarship information.
- Respond promptly to all correspondence from the Financial Aid Office. Do not wait until registration to finalize your financial aid. It should be complete before you register for classes.
- Take your placement exam prior to registration.
- Attend scheduled preorientation/preregistration session, meet with your advisor, and register for classes.
- Pay tuition by appropriate deadlines.

Placement and Challenge Exam Procedures

According to Alabama State Board of Education Policy 802.1, students may challenge their English, math, and/or reading ASSET®/COMPASS™ placement scores by retesting one time only if first scores are unsatisfactory. A fee of \$8 is charged to retake COMPASS™.

A CIS 146 challenge exam is also available. Students interested can contact Mr. David Cruz-Wells at 334-556-2255, 1-800-543-2426 (Ext. 2255), or e-mail dcruzwells@wallace.edu. No more than 10 applicants per test are allowed for this challenge exam. Students should arrive for tests promptly. No one will be tested after 15 minutes into the test. Contact Mr. Cruz-Wells 24 hours prior to testing to allow time for scheduling and resource allocation.

The Alabama Community College System Biology Placement Exam is available for students who desire to exempt BIO 103, which is the prerequisite for BIO 201—Anatomy and Physiology I and BIO 220—General Microbiology. A fee of \$26.25 is required prior to biology placement testing, and a student may not retest. Payment forms for all tests are available on the Wallace Campus in Grimsley Hall, Rooms 116, 119, and 120 and on the Sparks Campus in the Front Office of Building A.

Payment forms must be processed in the Business Office or appropriate designated office on each campus. Students must bring a receipt and their federal or state photo identification to the Test Center. For Test Center hours, contact the Wallace Campus at 334-983-3521 (Ext. 2208, 2281, and 2294) or the Sparks Campus at 334-687-3543 (Ext. 4210).

Technology-Based Instruction

Information About Online and Hybrid Classes

Wallace Community College uses Blackboard to support its online instructional programs. This technology provides students with an opportunity to pursue courses in formats that meet all course requirements while reducing in-class time. Faculty members are able to post course syllabi, contact information, and course content and ensure that students are aware of online activities that require participation, such as communicating with the instructor and other students, completing online assignments and quizzes, and posting course grades. Students must be aware of the requirements for each course in which they are enrolled.

Online and Hybrid Courses with On-campus Labs

The Internet is used to deliver instruction in the following courses.

- Online courses are delivered over the Internet using Blackboard. These courses will require the student's physical presence on campus to complete selected exams.
- Hybrid courses with on-campus labs are courses with hands-on lab components. Students are required to attend scheduled lab sessions at the designated campus.

Requirements and Assistance for Online and Hybrid Courses

- Starting Fall term 2011, students MUST complete the ELO 100-eLearning Orientation course prior to taking online courses.

Wallace Community College offers many classes that reduce the amount of time students must physically be on campus. These online and hybrid classes are indicated by “N” or “H” in the section number. While online classes do not require weekly meetings, they do require students to complete mid-term and final exams on campus under the direct supervision of the instructor. Hybrid classes require students to attend weekly on-campus meetings throughout the semester. Wallace Community College does not offer classes that are entirely online.

Students interested in taking online or hybrid classes should carefully consider their learning styles. These classes require students to be self-motivated and able to complete assignments with minimal supervision. Students should also possess strong computer skills. The ELO 100-eLearning Orientation course will help ensure that students are ready for online courses. The ELO 100-eLearning Orientation course is highly recommended for all students, even those not taking online courses.

NEW STUDENTS

Student Orientation, Advising, and Registration (SOAR) New student advising and preregistration sessions will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel via letter of invitation.

Placement Testing	Placement tests are required for all new students unless they meet exemption criteria as stated in the college catalog. Placement tests will be scheduled by Admissions and Records personnel by letter of invitation. Prior to the scheduled test date, the student must complete an Application for Admission. Students must bring a valid driver license or state-issued identification card to the testing session and may also bring a calculator. Students who desire to improve placement scores may contact the Counseling Office at 334-556-2294. An \$8 fee will be charged for retesting.
Tuition Payment	Tuition and fees are calculated on completion of advising and preregistration. Students have the option of paying tuition and fees anytime before 4:00 p.m., May 19 . Students who preregister but fail to pay tuition and fees by the noted deadline will be removed from the computer and are at risk of losing their class selections. If you are dropped for nonpayment, you must reregister May 31 or during late registration, June 1-2 . A late fee of \$25 is required for late registration, June 1-2 . All students, including those with scholarships and financial aid, must clear Business Office procedures to complete registration.

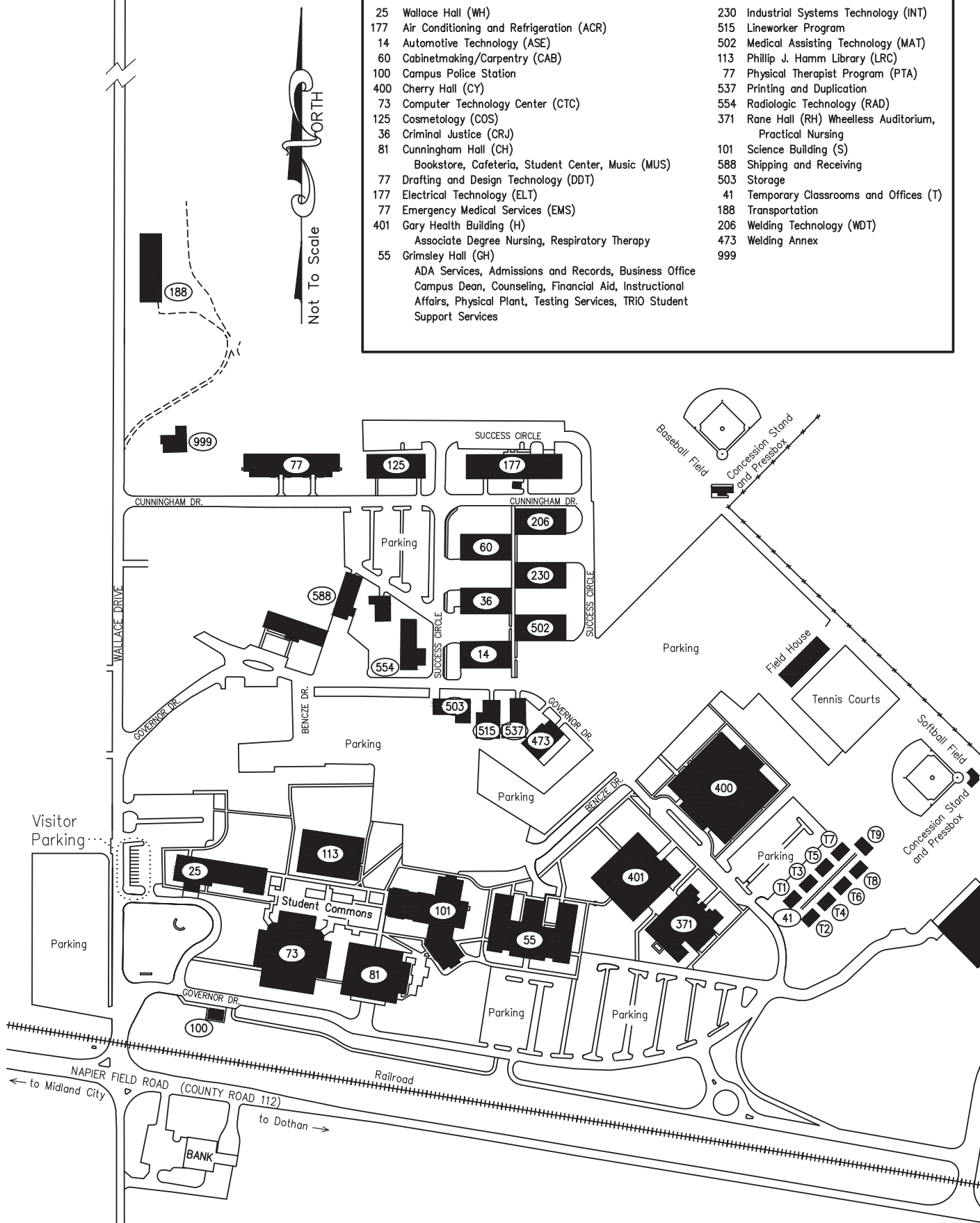

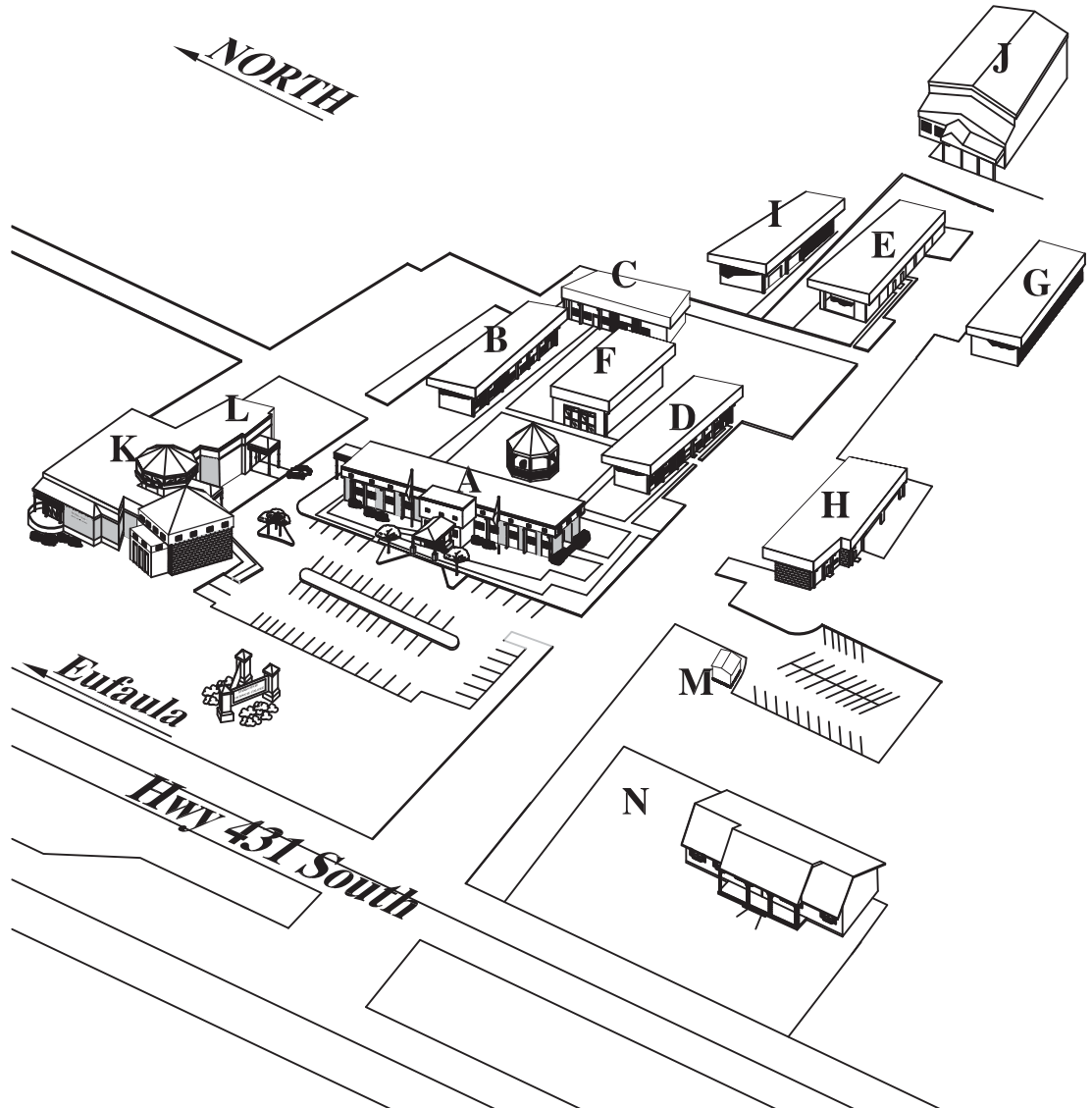

Workforce Development Classes

CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT (CNA)

An ongoing need exists for certified nurse assistants in the region. This 20-day course prepares students for the state board exam. Classes meet Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Tuition and fees are \$695. A minimum of seven students is required. WIA approved.

PROFESSIONAL MEDICAL CODING

This 80-hour course prepares students to take the AAPC coding exam. Classes meet on Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Course fees include tuition, all text and reference books, AAPC student membership, and exam. Tuition and fees are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. WIA approved.

OPHTHALMIC ASSISTANT

Develop your skills to assist an ophthalmologist or an optometrist in an eye-care facility. This 14-week training course could be the starting point for your new career in the health-care field. Tuition, fees, and textbook costs are \$1,400. A minimum of six students is required. WIA approved.

CERTIFIED DIETARY MANAGER

Become a trained food service manager who supervises kitchen operation services in long-term care facilities, hospitals, schools, correctional institutions, and other noncommercial food service settings. Tuition and fees are \$1,995. A minimum of five students is required. WIA approved.

PLUMBERS APPRENTICE COURSE

Develop your plumbing skills for entry into the plumbing field through this eight-month short course. The certified curriculum will be delivered in three modules in conjunction with the State of Alabama Plumbing and Gas Fitters Board. Learn plastic, copper, cast-iron, carbon, stainless, and carbon steel piping and fittings, as well as fixtures, faucets, water distribution systems, and plumbing codes used in the plumbing profession. Tuition is \$500 per module or \$1,500 for all modules. A minimum of eight students is required. WIA approved.

PREAPPRENTICE ELECTRICAL LINEWORKER TRAINING

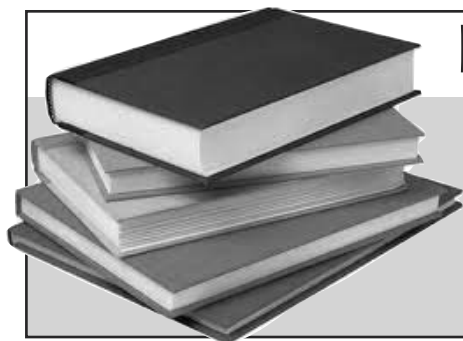
Develop skills to work in the electrical distribution industry by becoming a lineworker. This seven-week course will prepare you in pole climbing, CDL training, electrical theory, line make-ups, interpersonal skills, interview techniques, and much more. A minimum of eight students is required. WIA approved. Call 334-556-2203 for more information.

COMPUTER SKILLS FOR TODAY'S WORKPLACE

This six-week program will help students develop computer skills to work in an office environment. Skills range from basic use and keyboarding to proficiency in Microsoft® Excel®, PowerPoint®, and Word®. A minimum of four students is required. WIA approved.

READY TO WORK (RTW)

Ready To Work is a 10-week, employer-designed course that provides trainees with entry-level skills required for employment with most industries and businesses in Alabama. The training focuses on basic education (applied math, reading and locating information, and communication skills), computer skills (Microsoft® Excel®, Windows 2000®, and Word®), problem-solving, workplace behavior, manufacturing (precision measurement, safety), and job acquisition skills. A minimum of four students is required. This course is free to the public.

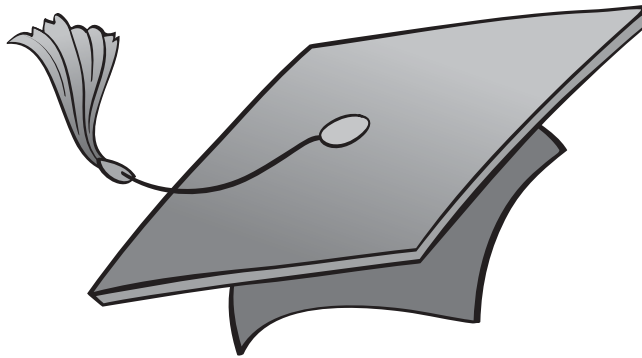

Final exams are in the appropriate time blocks as shown below, August 4 – August 10. Exam periods designated “open” and “proctored” may be used for make-up exams, proctored, hybrid, or online exams. The ENG 101 exit exams are Thursday, August 4, 8:00 a.m.-10:00 a.m. or 10:15 a.m. -12:15 p.m. **All grades are due by 9:00 a.m., Thursday, August 11.**

The table below outlines the exam dates and times for courses that follow the standard scheduling scheme. Sometimes there may be day and time combinations that do not exactly fit within this scheme. Faculty members in technical, nursing, and allied health programs whose courses combine theory, lab, and clinical meetings should use the theory meeting time to schedule their final exams. Those whose courses do not follow the standard scheduling scheme will determine test dates and times within the testing period that best complement the standard schedule. Faculty members teaching distance education classes and those who offer traditional course final exams via Blackboard will make arrangements for computer labs for their exams.
