The Greg Faison Memorial Scholarship for Children of First Responders

Whether you are paid or volunteer, First Responders are essential features of any disaster management effort. To apply, applicants are asked to write a 500+ word essay sharing their story by answering the question:

• How has being a child of a first responder impacted your life for the better (i.e. how has it influenced who you are, how you grew up, the decisions you've made, etc.)?

Once all of the submissions have been received, a senior member of our staff will review the entries and award \$3,000 to the one applicant who best demonstrates how being a child of a first responder has positively affected his/her life. The scholarship funds can be applied towards any school-related costs, such as tuition, boarding, school supplies, or books.

The Greg Faison Memorial Scholarship for Children of First Responders

TO BE ELIGIBLE, A PARTICIPANT MUST:

- Be graduating high school in 2020 or currently enrolled in an accredited technical school, college, or university in the United States;
- Be a U.S. citizen;
- Have a parent with a proper first responder classification (Police, EMT, paramedic, firefighter, and other emergency personnel); and
- Submit a 500+ word essay.

TO APPLY, A PARTICIPANT MUST SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING:

- Submit a 500+ word essay; How has being a child of a first responder impacted your life for the better (i.e. how has it influenced who you are, how you grew up, the decisions you've made, etc.)?
- Provide his/her first name, email address, home address, and phone number listed at the beginning of the essay;
- Include a copy of his/her transcript or any form of attendance verification at an accredited postsecondary institution; and
- Submit documented proof confirming his or her parent's status as a first responder (i.e. copy of badge # or ID).
