	Attached scores for the TEAS-V® Entrance Exam (ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills, version V). Students must create an account at www.atitesting.com to schedule a date for testing. Application packet must include a copy of the TEAS-V® score report (<i>Individual Performance Profile</i>). Applications received without test scores included will be considered ineligible for admission consideration and point ranking. Scores are good for three years. Students that have taken the TEAS-V® at any location other than the WCC Dothan campus or Sparks campus will be required to have official scores transferred to WCC. ATI assesses a \$25.00 fee to transfer these scores.
	Completed the Employment Verification Form (page 5) of the application packet. This form serves as documentation of employment as an LPN for a minimum of 500 clock hours, to have been worked within 12 months prior to the application deadline. Work experience will be accepted from any state.
	Attached a copy of your Alabama LPN license. Your LPN license must be valid and unencumbered.
	Students can submit a high school transcript for possible additional ranking points; however, this is not required.

THE ALABAMA COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM / WALLACE COMMUNITY COLLEGE NURSING PROGRAMS - ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

The Alabama Community College System endorses the Americans' with Disabilities Act. In accordance with College policy, when requested, reasonable accommodations may be provided for individuals with disabilities.

Physical, cognitive, psychomotor, affective and social abilities are required in unique combinations to provide safe and effective nursing care. The applicant/student must be able to meet the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations throughout the program of learning. Admission, progression and graduation are contingent upon one's ability to demonstrate the essential functions delineated for the nursing programs with or without reasonable accommodations. The nursing programs and/or its affiliated clinical agencies may identify additional essential functions. The nursing programs reserve the right to amend the essential functions as deemed necessary.

In order to be admitted and to progress in the nursing program one must possess a functional level of ability to perform the duties required of a nurse. Admission or progression may be denied if a student is unable to demonstrate the essential functions with or without reasonable accommodations.

The essential functions delineated are those deemed necessary the Alabama Community College System nursing programs. No representation regarding industrial standards is implied. Similarly, any reasonable accommodations made will be determined and applied to the respective nursing program and may vary from reasonable accommodations made by healthcare employers.

The essential functions delineated below are necessary for nursing program admission, progression and graduation and for the provision of safe and effective nursing care. The essential functions include but are not limited to the ability to:

- 1) Sensory Perception
 - a) Visual
 - Observe and discern subtle changes in physical conditions and the environment
 - ii) Visualize different color spectrums and color changes
 - iii) Read fine print in varying levels of light
 - iv) Read for prolonged periods of time
 - v) Read cursive writing
 - vi) Read at varying distances
 - vii) Read data/information displayed on monitors/equipment
 - o) Auditory
 - i) Interpret monitoring devices
 - ii) Distinguish muffled sounds heard through a stethoscope
 - iii) Hear and discriminate high and low frequency sounds produced by the body and the environment
 - iv) Effectively hear to communicate with others
 - c) Tactile
 - Discern tremors, vibrations, pulses, textures, temperature, shapes, size, location and other physical characteristics
 - d) Olfactory
 - i) Detect body odors and odors in the environment
- 2) Communication/Interpersonal Relationships
 - Verbally and in writing, engage in a two-way communication and interact effectively with others, from a variety of social, emotional, cultural and intellectual backgrounds
 - b) Work effectively in groups
 - c) Work effectively independently
 - d) Discern and interpret nonverbal communication
 - e) Express one's ideas and feelings clearly
 - f) Communicate with others accurately in a timely manner
 - g) Obtain communications from a computer
- 3) Cognitive/Critical Thinking
 - a) Effectively read, write and comprehend the English language
 - Consistently and dependably engage in the process of critical thinking in order to formulate and implement safe and ethical nursing decisions in a variety of health care settings
 - Demonstrate satisfactory performance on written examinations including mathematical computations without a calculator
 - d) Satisfactorily achieve the program objectives
- 4) Motor Function
 - Handle small delicate equipment/objects without extraneous movement, contamination or destruction
 - Move, position, turn, transfer, assist with lifting or lift and carry clients without injury to clients, self or others
 - c) Maintain balance from any position
 - d) Stand on both legs
 - e) Coordinate hand/eye movements
 - f) Push/pull heavy objects without injury to client, self or others
 - Stand, bend, walk and/or sit for 6-12 hours in a clinical setting performing physical activities requiring energy without jeopardizing the safety of the client, self or others
 - h) Walk without a cane, walker or crutches
 - i) Function with hands free for nursing care and transporting items
 - j) Transport self and client without the use of electrical devices
 - k) Flex, abduct and rotate all joints freely
 - Respond rapidly to emergency situations
 - m) Maneuver in small areas
 - n) Perform daily care functions for the client
 - Coordinate fine and gross motor hand movements to provide safe effective nursing care

- p) Calibrate/use equipment
- q) Execute movement required to provide nursing care in all health care settings
- r) Perform CPR and physical assessment
- s) Operate a computer
- 5) Professional Behavior
 - Convey caring, respect, sensitivity, tact, compassion, empathy, tolerance and a healthy attitude toward others
 - Demonstrate a mentally healthy attitude that is age appropriate in relationship to the client
 - c) Handle multiple tasks concurrently
 - d) Perform safe, effective nursing care for clients in a caring context
 - Understand and follow the policies and procedures of the College and clinical agencies

Informational Addendum:

TEAS-V[®] Entrance Exam for Spring 2013 Wallace Community College Associate Degree in Nursing and Practical Nursing Applicants

Effective with the Fall 2011 application process, applicants to all nursing programs under the direction of the Alabama Department of Postsecondary Education must submit scores received on the Test of Essential Academic Skills, Version Five (TEAS-V $^{\odot}$). Applicants must pre-register and pay for testing through the vendor site to reserve a seat at their desired testing session. An applicant may take the exam two (2) times during the application period and must wait at least six (6) weeks between tests. Although no minimum score is required, the score received on this test will count as a majority of points used in ranking applicants for admission selection (150 of 251 for ADN; 150 of 221 for PN). TEAS-V $^{\odot}$ scores are valid for three years.

The TEAS-V[®] measures basic essential skills in the academic content areas of reading, mathematics, science, and English and language usage. Students must create an account at www.atitesting.com to schedule a date for testing. All nursing applicants must include a copy of their TEAS-V[®] score report in their nursing program application packet. admission consideration and point ranking.

Guidelines for TEAS-V® Testing:

- TEAS-V[®] test administration at WCC will be computerized (four-option, multiple choice)
- Total time available to test: 209 minutes (3 hours and 29 minutes)
- Number of Test Questions: 170
- Points Possible: 150
 - o **Reading**: 58 minutes/ 48 questions o **Math**: 51 minutes/ 34 questions o **Science**: 66 minutes/ 54 questions
 - o English and language: 34 minutes/ 34 questions

Accommodations for Students with Disabilities:

Scoring on the TEAS-V[®] is utilized in the nursing entry process as points based on the percentage score equivalent. The **Adjusted Individual Total** score percentage score is utilized in calculating the nurse entry admission process. If the **Adjusted Individual Total Score is 94%, this will be calculated as 94% of the total 150 questions or 141 admission points.** There is no minimum score required on the TEAS-V[®], but a higher score produces a higher point total for nursing entry. Total points possible for nursing entry: ADN=251 and PN=221.

Cost of the TEAS-V[®] test is \$40.00. This fee must be paid in advance online by debit or credit card at www.atitesting.com.
YOU MUST PRE-REGISTER WITH ATI TO SCHEDULE A TESTING SESSION—WCC DOES NOT SCHEDULE SEATS OR RECEIVE PAYMENT. DO NOT COME TO A TESTING SESSION IF YOU HAVE NOT ALREADY PRE-REGISTERED AND RECEIVED YOUR USER ID AND PASSWORD!

Registering for the TEAS-V®:

- Log on to www.atitesting.com
- Click on "Register for TEAS[®]" at the bottom right corner of your screen.
- After completing the registration process, testers will be required to create a user account if they do not already
 have one prior to purchasing the test session. REMEMBER YOUR USER ID AND PASSWORD—IT
 WILL BE REQUIRED AT TIME OF TESTING.

Taking the TEAS-V®:

- Arrive 30 minutes early to the test site—NOTE: All TEAS-V[®] sessions are scheduled for the Wallace Campus in Dothan.
- Present one valid form of ID--must be a government-issued photo ID, i.e., Driver's License, Military ID, or Passport
- Provide ATI username and password www.atitesting.com assigned when registering/paying for the exam)
- No calculators, cell phones, pagers, PDAs, CD players, MP3 players, IPODs or other electronic devices allowed during test
- Bring two or more #2 pencils—scratch paper will be provided by the testing center
- Schedule yourself for four hours to complete the exam
- Late arrivals will not be allowed to test and will therefore forfeit the testing fee.

Please Note:

- ATI assesses a \$25.00 fee to transfer a TEAS-V® score to a location other than your original test site.
- Missed exams are non-refundable; however, you may change a test date by contacting ATI <u>at least 48</u> hours in advance of your originally scheduled testing date.
- TEAS-V[®] score is good for three years.
- TEAS-V[®] may be repeated only once during any semester admission cycle. The student must wait at least six weeks between testing attempts.
- Proof of TEAS-V[®] score must be attached to nursing applications.
