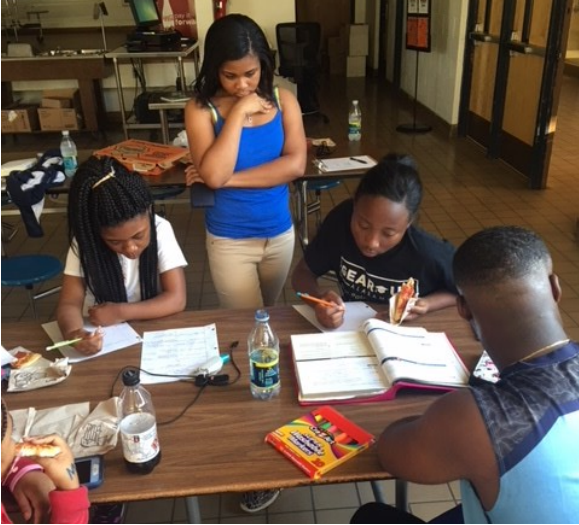

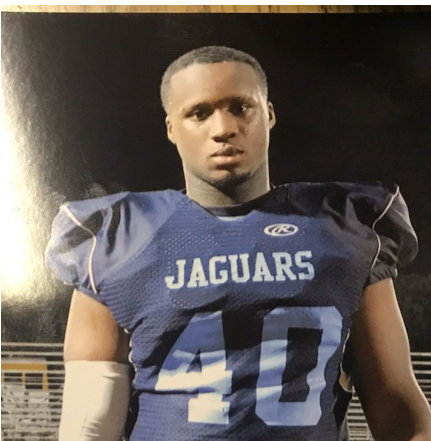
Need Help? No Problem! Senior Upward Bound Students Tutor Underclassmen

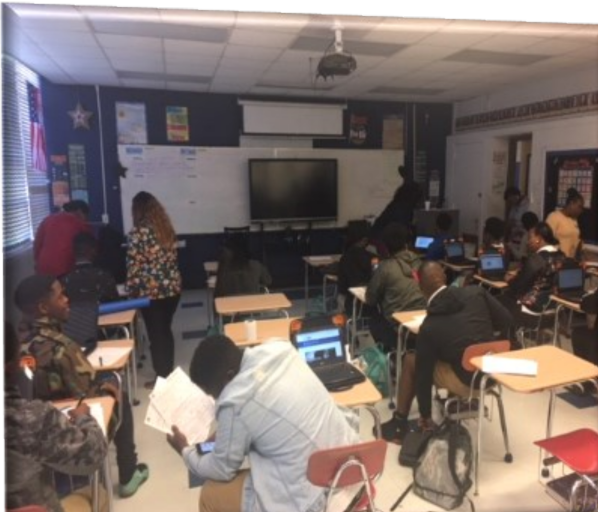
Abbeville High School Drum Major is Upward Bound Participant

TRiO Programs Participate in College Application Week



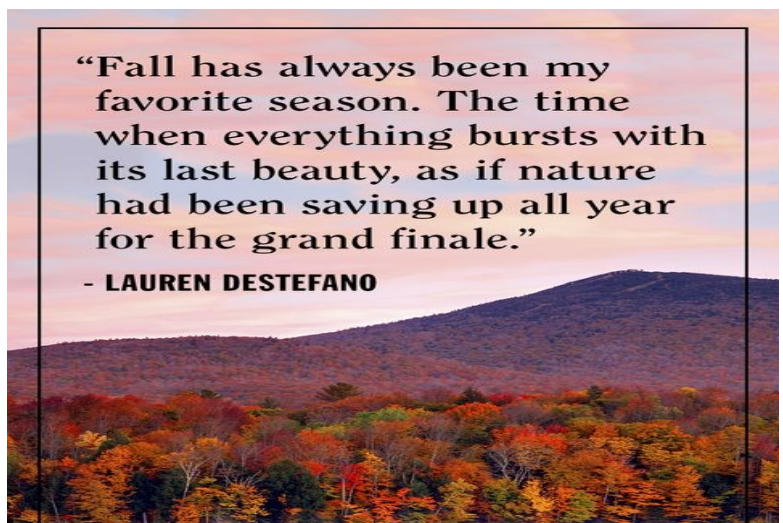
TRiO Student Support Services and Upward Bound Coordinator, Advisors, and a Wallace Community College Recruiter visited various area high schools for College Application Week! College Application Week is a program of the Alabama State Department of Education that aims to increase the number of first-generation and low-income students who pursue a postsecondary education by waiving application fees. During the visits, TRiO personnel assisted twelfth graders in applying to several colleges of interest. Some questions asked by the seniors were what colleges/universities are participating in College Application Week, and if certain majors are offered at the colleges of choice.



TRiO staff encouraged the students to apply to Wallace Community College along with four year colleges to increase their chances of acceptance and scholarship opportunities. The students showed excitement as they readied themselves for the next chapter of their lives and a brighter future.

Scholarships and Financial Aid Information

American Welding Society Foundation Scholarships.

Since 1991, the AWS has helped students from around the world to realize their dreams and make them a reality. AWS Foundation scholarships help students with financial obligations such as tuition and fees, books and other supplies.

The Jack Kent Cook Foundation Scholarship. The Jack Kent Cook Foundation will award Undergraduate Transfer Scholarships to outstanding community college students transferring to selective four-year colleges or universities in fall 2019. In order to apply, applicants must submit an electronic application through the Common App for Transfer, which can be accessed via the Foundation’s website at www.jkcf.org. **Deadline to apply is Tuesday, November 27, 2018, at 11:59 p.m. CST.**

The E. L. Gibson Foundation Scholarships (External). The E. L. Gibson Foundation promotes better health for the residents of specific Wiregrass areas. It provides scholarships to assist persons seeking a degree in the health care fields. Applicants must be permanent residents of Coffee County or the immediate areas of Geneva, Dale, or Covington Counties. **Deadline to apply is November 30, 2018.**
