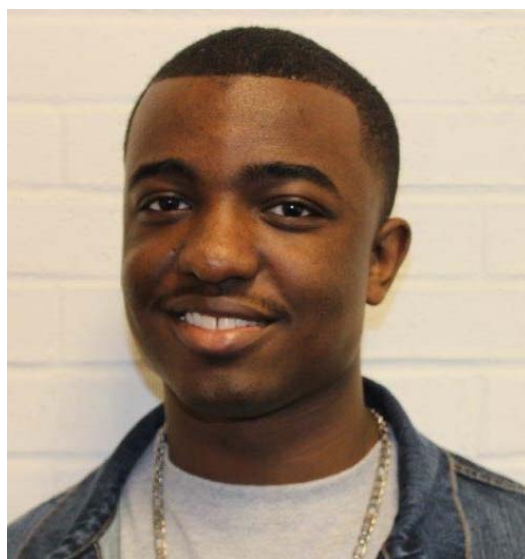

## DeMichael Turner Earns Transfer Scholarship to AUM

DeMichael Turner earned a Transfer Scholarship to Auburn University at Montgomery. The Transfer Scholarship pays a total of \$5000 toward a student's tuition or \$2500 per academic year. Transfer Scholarships are offered to incoming transfer students who have completed their sophomore year with a 3.5 grade point average at an Alabama Community College. The transfer student must be enrolled full-time (a minimum of 12 semester hours) at AUM and maintain a 3.0 GPA on work completed at Auburn University in Montgomery.

DeMichael is from Clayton, Alabama and graduated from Barbour County High School in 2013. He came to Wallace Community College as part of the TRiO First Year College Experience program in fall 2013. DeMichael plans to graduate from WCC in May 2015 and transfer to Auburn University in Montgomery in fall 2015. He plans to major in Human Resource Management. This field attracted him because he wants to help others find jobs that fit their education and interests.
