The University of Alabama is offering one (1) Presidential Scholarship to a student desiring to transfer to their university during the 2016-2017 academic year. **Deadline to apply is 4:00 p.m. on Monday, February 29, 2016.**

Fall 2016 Wallace Community College Academic, Career Technical, Performing Arts, and Health Sciences Scholarships.

Wallace Community College offers scholarships in four areas: academic, career technical, performing arts, and health sciences. **The application deadline is 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, March 1, 2016, to be eligible for financial aid beginning in August 2016.**
