



Scholarships and Financial Aid Information

The Glen Lerner Gives Back Community Scholarship will be awarded to the student whose personal essay best describes their commitment to community service and how their experience has played and will play a role in their academic career. Deadline to submit completed application is no later than January 31, 2018.

The Preszler Injury Lawyers –Triumphing Over Adversity Scholarship will be awarded to the student who demonstrably embodies the determination, ability and steadfast commitment not only to their own personal success, but also to promoting the greater good for those in need. Deadline to submit completed application is no later than January 31, 2018.

2017 Seth Okin Good Deeds Scholarship (External). All applicants must submit a full application (personal essay, transcript, and cover sheet). Deadline: No later than January 31, 2018 by email to scholarships@crimnallawyermaryland.net.

2018 Alabama Municipal Electric Authority Scholarship (External). To be eligible for an AMEA scholarship, a student's parent and/or legal guardian must receive electric service from an AMEA Member utility. Granted only to graduating high school seniors, the student must attend a four-year college/university, community college, and/or vocational /trade school within the state of Alabama. Forty-four, \$2,500 scholarships are available. For an application, visit the AMEA web site, www.amea.com, Scholarship Program. Application deadline for the 2018 program is Monday, February 12, 2017.

Daughters of the American Revolution Scholarships. The NSDAR awards multiple scholarships to students showing dedication to the pursuit of degrees in diverse disciplines including history, law, nursing, and education. Scholarship applications must be emailed by February 15, 2018, at 12 midnight (EST).
