Scholarship. This scholarship will be awarded to a student who can successfully communicate in an essay a time he/she faced an emotional or physical setback and how this experience has helped them grow as an individual. **Deadline to submit** completed application is July 1, 2017.

2017-2018 Leadership In Child Care Scholarship. The

Leadership in Child Care Scholarship provides financial assistance (tuition and selected fees) to gualified child care professionals working in legally operating child care facilities. The Scholarship is designed for the eligible recipient to obtain a Child Development Associate (CDA) Credential, Short-Term Certificate, Certificate, Associate in Applied Science/Technology Degree in Child Development/Early Care and Education at a designated institution in the ACCS. The Scholarship also offers a Bachelor of Science Degree in Early Childhood Education at Athens. The Alabama Community College System must receive applications no later than September 1st for Spring and Summer Semester enrollment

2017 InformedMag Security Scholarship (External).

InformedMag is offering a \$1,000 scholarship to students based on their ability to effectively communicate their experience with a product. The "InformedMag Security Scholarship" is offered on an annual basis and is awarded on January 15th each year. The application deadline is December 31, 2017.

Glen Lerner Gives Back Community Scholarship.
