

In downtown Dothan, the students visited the G. W. Carver Interpretive Museum which is located in a formerly segregated bus station. While downtown they were given a brief tour of the murals painted by various artists on the sides of buildings. The murals included a local man named "Dancing Dave," a wildlife piece by an Eufaula, Alabama artist, and a Dothan church. The students were amazed by the paintings.

Scholarships and Financial Aid Information

The E. L. Gibson Foundation Scholarships (External). The E. L. Gibson Foundation promotes better health for the residents of specific Wiregrass areas. It provides scholarships to assist persons seeking a degree in the health care fields. Applicants must be permanent residents of Coffee County or the immediate areas of Geneva, Dale, or Covington Counties. Deadlines to apply are: May 31, August 31, and November 30.

Fall 2018 Horatio Alger National Career and Technical Scholarship. Scholarships for \$2,500 are available to students interested in pursuing a career or technical certificate/degree. The application is now available for students who will be enrolled in a post-secondary program in Fall 2018. The application deadline is June 15, 2018.
