PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT AAS CURRICULUM

Students may complete some or all of the general education (non-PTA) courses prior to admission to the Physical Therapist Assistant program. The following course of study should serve as a guideline for registration and program completion. Placement testing in English, math, and reading or appropriate ACT/SAT scores is required for all entering freshmen. Placement determines the starting point for college-level courses. It is strongly suggested that interested students make an appointment with one of the program faculty prior to application to review general education requirements. Acceptance into the Physical Therapist Assistant program is required prior to enrolling in any PTA-prefix course. PTA courses are sequential and cannot be combined to shorten the length of the program. All courses listed in the PTA curriculum must be completed with a "C" or higher.
