

STANDARD PRACTICAL NURSING CURRICULUM

Below is the standard Practical Nursing curriculum. The curriculum is designed to be finished in only three semesters (one calendar year) for the traditional day program track, but at times may be adjusted per individual student needs. Students may complete some or all of the general education (non-nursing) courses prior to admission to the PN program. Upon admission to the program, students must complete any remaining general education courses prior to or within the semester listed, in order to progress in the program.

Students must successfully complete all NUR courses within each semester listed prior to progressing to the next semester. NUR courses are sequential and cannot be combined. All courses listed in the PN curriculum must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.

Total Program Credit Hours: 51 Hours

Students must maintain current cardiopulmonary resuscitation certification throughout the PN program in order to participate in clinical experiences. Certification must be American Heart Association or American Red Cross Basic Life Support (BLS) for Health Care Providers (CPR/AED). On-line certification without hands-on skill validation is not acceptable to meet this requirement. Two options exist for obtaining this certification:

- take through the College by registering for EMS 100 prior to or concurrent with NUR 102
- take courses by either of the above named providers at any other approved agency or facility and present proof of successful completion prior to registration for NUR 102

Comprehensive Assessment (CA) through use of standardized and validated assessment tools will be incorporated into each NUR-prefix course. This assessment may or may not comprise a portion of grade calculation and is intended to aid in advisement, counseling, and/or remediation of students. Costs associated with CA are the responsibility of the individual student.
