## CERTIFICATE OF EXEMPTION

All persons between the ages of seven and 17 years of age are required by State Law to attend school for the minimum number of scholastic days prescribed by the State Board of Education. All students must attend school or must be instructed privately unless the student holds a Certificate of Exemption.
