








UAB ECONOMIC ENGAGEMENT SNAPSHOT

UAB SPENDING WITH SUPPLIERS IN 6-COUNTY REGION



Two-Year College Feedback Reports

This series of reports analyzes the academic performance of students who were enrolled at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) during the academic year beginning Summer 2017 and ending Spring 2018, and who were identified as transfer students from Alabama public two-year institutions. For the purpose of this report, a transfer student is defined as *any student who had 15 or more semester hours earned* from a specific two-year college that were accepted by UAB as creditable toward degree completion. Information is provided to each Alabama public two-year institution that had 10 or more of its former students enrolled at UAB during the study period who met this transfer student definition. Students may be defined as a transfer student from more than one two-year college in this report series.

Report 1 lists the students from the selected two-year colleges who enrolled for their first term at UAB during the Summer 2017 – Spring 2018 academic year. Information provided includes the number of hours from that institution that were accepted by UAB for degree credit and the grade point average of those accepted hours, as well as first term at UAB, with hours enrolled, major, and grade point average earned by the student during that first term. In any case where the average grade is null, the student(s) was dropped administratively from the course post-Census but prior to end of term.

Report 2 lists all courses taken during the first term of UAB enrollment by the students included in Report 1, and includes the grades earned as well as the average grade in each course for all UAB undergraduates during the included terms. When students entered during different terms but took the same course during their respective first terms, these grades are combined. For example, six grades displayed in English Composition may have been taken over three different semesters. The UAB average also reflects all terms.

Report 3 lists the transfer students who received an undergraduate degree from UAB during the reporting period. Information provided includes the initial term of UAB enrollment for the student, the number of hours earned at UAB, the term, degree and major of graduation, and the final UAB grade point average.

Report 4 examines academic performance of all transfer students from the two-year institution who were enrolled at UAB during the reporting period, without regard to when the student first enrolled at UAB. Grade point averages of the students are distributed by both the number of hours accepted by UAB from the two-year college and by the number of semester hours earned at UAB through Spring 2018. Mean grade point averages from UAB and from the two-year institution based on the hours shown are displayed.

Report 5 is a summary of transfers to UAB from all of the institutions included in the 2017-2018 report. Displayed for each two-year institution are: the number of students entering UAB during the reporting year (students included in Reports 1 and 2), the total number of transfer students enrolled at UAB during the reporting year without regard to first term of enrollment (students included in Report 4), transfer students who graduated during the reporting period (all students included in Report 3), and the top majors chosen by the entering transfer students upon initial enrollment at UAB.
