### Summary

Wallace Community College – Dothan (WCCD) enrolled 3,824 students in Spring 2025. The majority of students enrolled were female (68%), White (56%), and/or enrolled part-time (68%). The majority of students resided in Houston County (37%).

Programs with the highest enrollment included General Studies/Liberal Arts, Associate Degree Nursing, and Practical Nursing. In Spring 2025, there were 823 course sections offered, totaling 31,747 credit hours.

1,824 students received Pell in Spring 2025, totaling \$4,675,372, with the average aid being \$2,563.25. The majority of students receiving Pell were female (78%), White (48%), and/or part-time (56%).

In Spring 2025, WCCD employed 121 full-time faculty with a cumulative credit hour production of 28,784 and 39 part-time faculty with a cumulative credit hour production of 2,963.




