Summary

Wallace Community College – Dothan (WCCD) enrolled 2,376 students in Summer 2025. The majority of students enrolled were female (69%), White (53%), and/or enrolled part-time (83%). The majority of students resided in Houston County (36%).

Programs with the highest enrollment included General Studies/Liberal Arts, Associate Degree Nursing, and Cosmetology. During Summer 2025, 495 course sections were offered, generating a total of 17,485 credit hours.

A total of 1,280 students received Pell Grant aid, amounting to \$2,722,675, with an average award of \$2,127.09. The majority of Pell recipients were female (76%), White (47%), and/or part-time (80%).

During the term, WCCD employed 103 full-time faculty, who produced 16,436 credit hours, and 14 part-time faculty, who produced 1,049 credit hours.

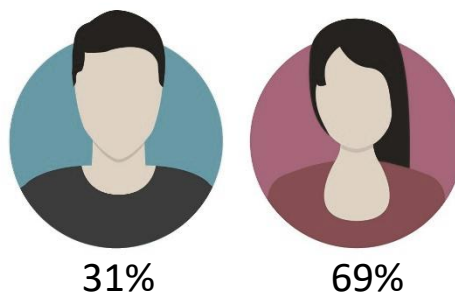

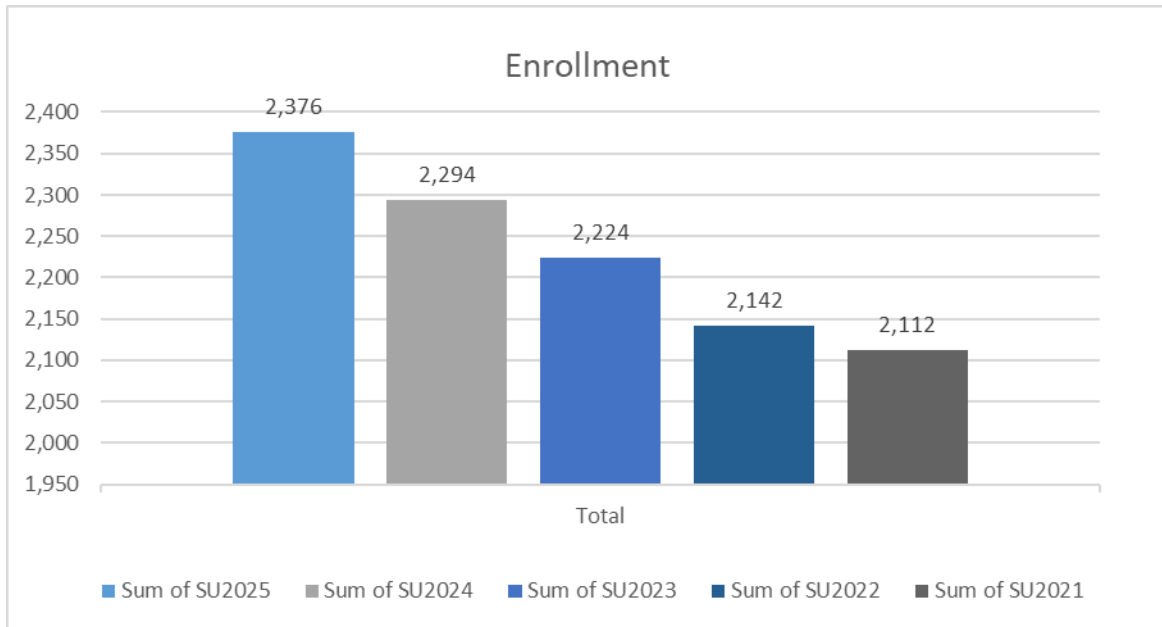

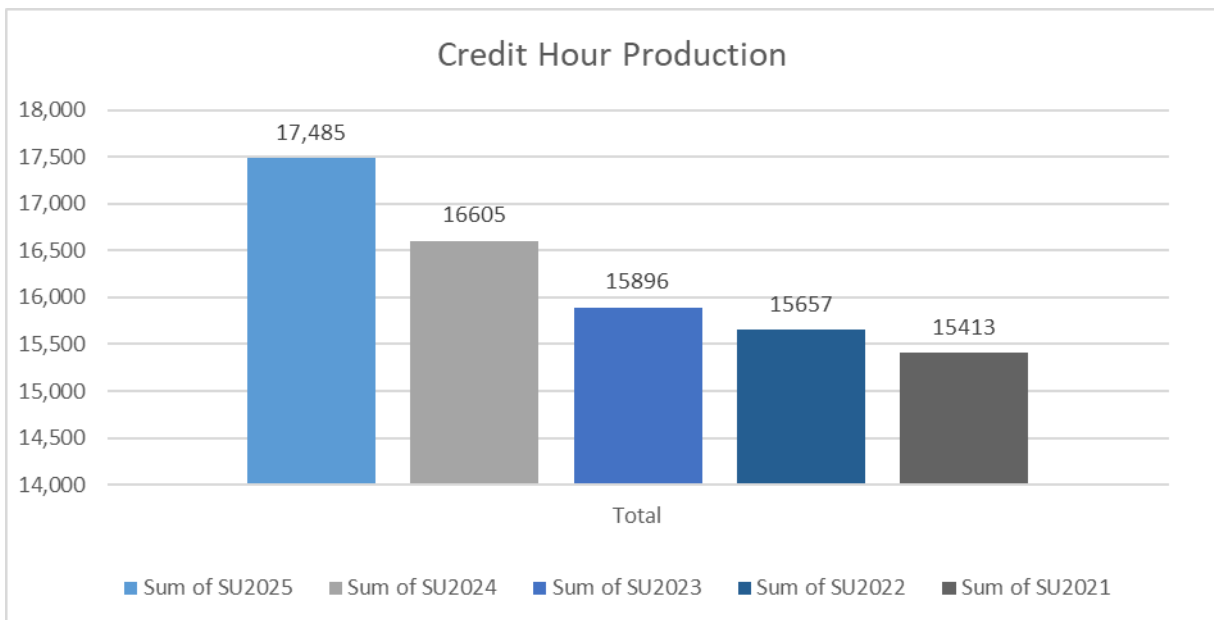
